

Each person who returns to Belgium from any foreign country or who wishes to stay in Belgium for more than 48 hours will have to fill in an identification form (Passenger Locator Form) https://travel.info-coronavirus.be/fr/public-health-passengerlocator-form LEGAL OBLIGATIONS WHEN YOU RETURN Mandatory quarantine and screening when you return from all countries outside the EU and the Schengen area and from all red zones Obligation to contact your general practitioner and mention your travel history in order to undergo testing. Quarantine and

screening are recommended

Contact tracing is one of the measures to prevent the spread of the virus.

A staff member of the authorities will call you. It is important that you answer the questions as fully as possible: He or she will ask you about the list of contacts you drew up.

Those data will be treated confidentially
